The Road Department and the Weed District presented a new piece of safety foot protection equipment to the Safety Committee prior to this meeting. The Safety Committee reviewed the steel toed boot/shoe cover and found them to be an acceptable addition to steel toed boots or shoes requirement for employees in those Departments. Moved by Morrow and seconded by Brayton to authorize the payment of the steel toed slip on devices for the Road and Weed Departments. These devices will be owned by Buffalo County for County use only. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Morrow, Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Reiter and Klein. Absent: McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Buffalo County Sheriff Neil Miller was present for the discussion on an RFP (Request for Proposal) for jail medical services. Moved by Greder and seconded by Morrow to authorize Sheriff Miller to prepare and present an RFP for the jail medical services to the Board at a later meeting. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Greder, Morrow, Biehl, Brayton, Reiter and Klein. Absent: McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

Vice Chairman Klein reviewed the following correspondence. State of Nebraska Department of Roads sent a notice of the change of the purchase rate of funds for each Local Public Agencies under the Federal Funds Purchase Program. Planning & Zoning Administrator LeAnn Klein sent a notice of the Planning & Zoning Commissioner’s terms that will expire on November 30, 2015. UNL Extension sent an invitation for the annual 4-H Banquet to be held on November 1, 2015. Vincent Valentino, an attorney for NIRMA sent a letter about jail liability issues. Vice Chairman Klein called on each Board member present for committee reports and recommendations.

## **ZONING**

Vice Chairman Klein opened the Zoning hearing at 9:28 A.M. for a zoning map amendment. Zoning Administrator LeAnn Klein was present for the request submitted by Trenton Snow on behalf of Ronald Campbell for a change of zoning from Agricultural to Agricultural-Residential for property described as tract of land being part of the North Half of the Southeast Quarter in Section 32,

Township 9 North, Range 17 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Buffalo County, Nebraska. Trenton Snow and Ron Campbell reviewed the application. Allen Bors spoke in opposition to the zoning map amendment. Vice Chairman Klein closed the hearing at 9:41 A.M. Moved by Biehl and seconded by Greder to grant the zoning map amendment with the following Resolution 2015-55. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Biehl, Greder, Brayton, Morrow, Reiter and Klein. Absent: McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

### **RESOLUTION 2015-55**

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2015, Surveyor Trenton Snow on behalf of Ronald R. Campbell has applied for a zoning map amendment with the Buffalo County Zoning Administrator requesting that the following real estate property, hereinafter referred to as the “subject property”, to wit:

A tract of land being part of the North Half of the Southeast Quarter (N ½ SE ¼ ) of Section Thirty-two (32), Township Nine (9) North, Range Seventeen (17) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, more particularly described as follows: Referring to the Northwest corner of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 32 and assuming the North line of said Southeast Quarter as bearing N 89°50'24" E and all bearings contained herein are relative thereto; thence N 89°50'24" E and on the aforesaid North line a distance of 1019.1 feet to the ACTUAL PLACE OF BEGINNING; thence continuing on the aforesaid North line N 89°50'24" E a distance of 191.48 feet to a point being on the South right-of-way line of Kearney Canal; thence S 66°13'38" E and on the aforesaid South right-of-way line a distance of 63.5 feet; thence S 75°51'50" E a distance of 160.4 feet; thence S 80°45'23" E a distance of 200.55 feet; thence N 88°17'45" E a distance of 184.14 feet; thence leaving said South right-of-way line SOUTH a distance of 542.52 feet to a point on the North right-of-way line of U.S. Highway No. 30; thence N 80°45'30" W and continuing on the aforesaid North right-of-way line a distance of 800.83 feet; thence N 00°23'04" E a distance of 506.0 feet to the place of beginning. Containing 9.38 acres, more or less. be changed from the Agricultural “AG” District to the Agricultural-Residential (AGR) District,

WHEREAS, this is solely a zoning map amendment request and the subject property would or could have other land use regulations that would apply to it above and beyond the zoning map amendment sought at this meeting, and

WHEREAS, on September 17, 2015, the Buffalo County Planning and Zoning Commission following public hearing with notice as required recommended approval of such proposed change in zoning on an 8-0 vote with no conditions placed on the proposed map amendment, and

WHEREAS, on October 13, 2015, this Board conducted a public hearing and considered this Zoning Map Amendment, the minutes of the Planning and Zoning Commission considering this amendment, Buffalo County Zoning Regulations, and Comprehensive Plan, and finds:

- a. That one citizen voiced opposition against the amendment.
- b. That such change in zoning designation would have minimal adverse effect on surrounding properties.
- c. That the intended uses of the Agricultural-Residential District is consistent with property use in the surrounding area.
- d. This amendment is consistent with the growth and development of Buffalo County and the overall Comprehensive Plan adopted by Buffalo County, Nebraska, and
- e. The subject property is situated close to already existing public improvements, such as paved roads and sufficient utilities so that the map amendment with its attendant changes in uses will not cause additional public costs to function effectively.

WHEREAS, no protest (s) against such amendment have been filed with the Buffalo County Clerk with seven days of conclusion of public hearing of such Commission as allowed under Section 11.4, and

WHEREAS, the votes in favor of adoption of this resolution need only be by majority of members to this Board of Commissioners.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS that application for zoning map amendment to change the subject property from the Agricultural (A) District to the Agricultural-Residential (AGR) District is approved, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be filed in the Register of Deed’s office against subject property and any parcel situated partially or entirely within such legal description, and that the County Clerk shall make amendment to Buffalo County Zoning District Map originally adopted on or about September 10, 2002.

A public hearing was held on September 22, 2015 for an administrative subdivision that was requested by Trenton Snow on behalf of John C. and Amy A. Ourada for property described as part of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter located in Section 9, Township 9 North, Range 18 West of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Buffalo County, Nebraska to be known as Landing Acres. The Board tabled the decision until this Board meeting. Moved by Brayton and seconded by Biehl to approve Landing Acres with the following Resolution

2015-56. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted “Aye”: Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and Klein. Absent: McMullen. None voted “Nay”. Motion declared carried.

### **RESOLUTION 2015-56**

WHEREAS, Trenton Snow, licensed surveyor, on behalf of John C. Ourada and Amy A. Ourada, husband and wife, hereinafter referred to as “applicant” have filed for an Administrative Subdivision to be known as “LANDING ACRES” with the Buffalo County Clerk and/or Zoning Administrator, and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Administrator forwarded this application to this Board, and

WHEREAS, on September 22, 2015, this Board conducted a public hearing and now finds:

1. The proposed “LANDING ACRES” is in the Agricultural (AG) Zoning District for Buffalo County, Nebraska and the size of the parcels of real estate owned by the subdividing entity after subdividing complies with the minimum lot size of this zoning district.
2. The proposed plat for this subdivision fulfills Buffalo County’s Subdivision Resolution requirements for administrative subdivisions specifically allowed under Section 3.02 together with other provisions applicable thereto.
3. 100<sup>th</sup> Road is a county maintained open public road that abuts the proposed subdivision to the north. The width of these roads after dedication complies with the minimum width standards required by the Buffalo County Subdivision Resolution.
4. Title search paperwork has been provided to the Buffalo County Attorney’s Office and that office has cleared title as concerns Buffalo County’s interests based upon the title search documents delivered to that office by applicant.
5. Several persons appeared before the Board at the public hearing in protest this administrative subdivision. The basic issue of these protests is that this subdivision will increase the density of residential use in a rural area. With or without this subdivision, Buffalo County’s Zoning Resolution places spacing limitations and density limitations on property that is situated in the Agricultural Zoning District. If a residence were to be placed on the subject property, it would be allowed under the zoning code. This administrative subdivision, under Buffalo County’s Zoning and Subdivision Development Resolutions, meets all criteria necessary to approve it. The Board has no grounds upon which it can deny this application.
6. This proposed administrative subdivision should be approved.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS in regular session with a quorum present, that the plat of “LANDING ACRES”, an administrative subdivision being described as being part of the Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (NW ¼ NE ¼ ) of Section Nine (9), Township Nine (9) North, Range Eighteen (18) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, duly made out, acknowledged and certified, is hereby approved, accepted, ratified, and authorized to be filed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Buffalo County, Nebraska

Highway Superintendent Ron Sklenar was present for the following Agenda items.

Road Chairman Klein instructed County Clerk Giffin to open and read aloud the submitted bids for Bridge Deck Rehabilitation. Bids were submitted from Cramer & Associates Inc., Simon Contractors, PCiRoads LLC, Wildcat Construction Co. Inc. and Wilke Contracting Corp. The Road Committee and Highway Superintendent will review the bids and come back with recommendations at the next meeting on October 27, 2015.

Road Chairman Klein instructed County Clerk Giffin to open and read aloud the submitted bids for 2016 Structure Replacements. Bids were submitted from Ramos Construction, Midlands Contracting Inc. and A&R Construction Co. The Road Committee and Highway Superintendent will review the bids and come back with recommendations at the next meeting on October 27, 2015.

Road Chairman Klein instructed County Clerk Giffin to open and read aloud the submitted bids for Structure No C001003510 Bridge Replacement. Bids were submitted from Simon Contractors and Wilke Contracting Corp. The Road Committee and Highway Superintendent will review the bids and come back with recommendations at the next meeting on October 27, 2015.

Joe Woodward was present regarding subdivision road maintenance at 85<sup>th</sup> Street and Cottonmill Avenue. Woodward was directed to visit with Highway Superintendent Ron Sklenar about the Buffalo County guidelines on certain road maintenance.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Biehl to approve the following Resolution 2015-57 to set a public hearing of November 10, 2015 at 10:00 A.M. for the petition to vacate a portion of public road known as 325<sup>th</sup> Road between Ravenna Road and Buckeye Road.
