has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East quarter of Section thirty-two in Township eleven North of Range eight West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General :
