No. 2899 : WHEREAS William McCannon of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that FULL PAYMENT has been made by the said William McCannon according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto, for

the South half of the south east quarter, and the South half of the south west quarter of Section two in Township twelve north of Range sixteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands, returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said William McCannon

NOW KNOW YE, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT; unto the said William McCannon and to his heirs, the said Tract above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the right, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever, nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said William McCannon and to his heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
