To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1878, "To encourage the growth of Timber on the Western Prairies," the claim of Josiah D. Mc Cartney has been established and duly enumerated, in conformity to law, for the South East quarter of Section eighteen in Township ten North of Range eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, that there is, therefore granted by the United States unto the said Josiah D. Mc Cartney the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Josiah D. Mc Cartney and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, hath caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the Twenty-third day of April, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twentieth.
