Meier has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East quarter of Section nine in Township twelve North, Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.

Now know ye, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Henry H. Meier the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereto unto the said Henry H. Meier and to his heirs and assigns forever.
