To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:
 Certificate Whereas, Thomas B. Mickle of Buffalo County, Nebraska,
 No. 1881 } has deposited in the General Land Office of the United
 States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island
 Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment had been made by
 the said Thomas B. Mickle according to the provisions of the Act of Con-
 gress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An Act making further provisions
 for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the
 South East Quarter of Section six, in Township Eleven north of range fourteen
 west of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred
 and sixty acres according to the official plat of the Survey of said lands,
 returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract
 has been purchased by the said Thomas B. Mickle. Now know ye, that
 the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in
 conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such cases made and
 provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and
 grant, unto the said Thomas B. Mickle and to his heirs, the said
 Tract above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all
 the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of what soever
 nature, therein belonging, unto the said Thomas B. Mickle and
 to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, J. Grover Cleveland, President of the United
 States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the
 seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hands, at the City of Washington, the twenty second
 day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
 and eighty five, and of the Independence of the United States the
 one hundred and tenth.
