The United States of America,
To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Acts of Congress, approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874, and June 14, 1875, "to encourage the growth of timber on the Western prairie", the claim of James H. Mills has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the lots numbered one and two and the East half of the North West quarter of section thirty in Township Ten North of Range thirteen West of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fifty-eight acres and twenty five hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said James H. Mills the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said James H. Mills and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have caused this letter to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety three, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and seventeenth.
