Now know ye, that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said }  
 Hugh Miller the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract }  
 of Land, with the Appurtenances thereof, unto the said Hugh Miller and to his heirs }  
 and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of Am- }  
 erica, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land }  
 Office to be hereunto affixed.
