Moore of Buffalo County, Nebraska, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William E. Moore, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress on the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the public lands", and the acts supplemental thereto, for the West Half of the North East Quarter and the North Half of the Northwest Quarter of Section Six, in Township Eleven, North of Range Fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and Fifty-eight acres and ninety-five Hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said William E. Moore.

NOW KNOW YE, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, Have Given and Granted, and by these presents Do Give and Grant, unto the said William E. Moore, and to his heirs the tract above described;
