 No 4986 } Whereas Thomas E. Muddle of Buffalo County Nebraska
 has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate
 of the Register of that Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby
 it appears that full payment has been made by the said Thomas
 E. Muddle according to the provisions of the act of Congress of
 the 24th of April 1820 entitled "An act making further provision for
 the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the
 lot numbered nine of section Twelve in Township Eight North
 of Range Fourteen West, and the lot numbered Five of
 Section Seven in Township Eight North of Range Thirteen West
 of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing sixty
 three acres and ten hundredths of an acre according to the
 Official Plot of the Survey of the said lands returned to the
 General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said Tract
 has been purchased by the said Thomas E. Muddle.

Now know Ye That the United States of America in consid-
 eration of the premises and in conformity with the several
 Acts of Congress in such case made made and provided
 have given and granted and by these presents Do give and
 Grant unto the said Thomas E. Muddle and to his heirs
 the said Tract above described; To have and to hold the same
 together with all the rights privileges immunities and appurtenances
 of whatsoever nature therein to belonging unto the said Thomas
 E. Muddle and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I, Benjamin Harrison President of the
 United States of America have caused these letters to be made
 Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto
 affixed.

 day of July in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight

 States the one hundred and fiftieth.
