To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:
Be it remembered that Whereas George Myers of Buffalo County
Nebraska has deposited in the General Land
Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the
Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears
that full payment has been made by the said George
Myers according to the provisions of the Act of Congress
of the 21st of April 1820 entitled "An Act making further
provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the act
supplemental thereto for the West half of the South West
Quarter of Section Seven in Township Twelve North of
Range Seventeen West and the South East Quarter of the
South East Quarter of Section Twelve in Township Twelve
North of Range eighteen West of the Sixth Principal
Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and fourteen
acres and seventy hundredths of an acre, according to
the official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the
General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been
purchased by the said George Myers. Now know Ye that the
United States of America in consideration of the premises and
in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case
made and provided have given and granted and by these
presents do give and grant unto the said George Myers
and to his heirs the said tract above described, do have
and do hold the same together with all the rights, privileges,
immunities and appurtenances of whatever nature
thereunto belonging unto the said George Myers and to
his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof I Benjamin
Harrison President of the United States of America have caused
these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land
Office to be hereunto affixed, Given under my hand at
the City of Washington the eighth day of February in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, of the
Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
