Witnesseth; that the said parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Four Thousand Dollars, in gold coin of the United States of America, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents; the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted bargained sold, and conveyed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns forever all that certain lot, piece or parcel of land, situate lying and being in Kearney County of Buffalo State of Nebraska and bounded and particularly described as follows to-wit:

Lot No Second (2) in South Kearney an Addition to Kearney Nebraska, together with all improvements thereon.

Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions remainders and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof. Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May 1862, "to secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Jean Fauthmil has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North West Quarter of Section Twenty-six, in Township Ten, North of Range Fifteen, West, of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing One Hundred and Sixty acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General;
