Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May 1862 "To secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Albert Bellows, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law for the North West quarter of section Six, in Township Eight North of Range Sixteen west, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island, Nebraska, containing One hundred and forty six acres, and seventy one hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General;

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore deposited granted by the United States unto the said Albert Bellows, the tract of land above described; To have and hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Albert Bellows, and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, I Ulyses S. Grant President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General ^{Land} Office to be hereunto affixed
