The United States of America. To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting: Whereas William A. Flickinger of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said William A. Flickinger to the provision of the Act of Congress of the 21<sup>st</sup> of April 1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto for the South half of the South east quarter of section eleven and the South half of the South West quarter of section twelve in Township eight, north of range fifteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said William A. Flickinger. Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said William A. Flickinger and to his heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging, unto the said William A. Flickinger and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand, at the City of Washington the twenty second day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty five, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and tenth.
