Bean, formerly Kate M. Frost has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North West Quarter of Section Thirty four in Township eleven north of Range Sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
