

the said sale ratified and confirmed by said Court and all the proceeds thereof fully accounted for by said administrator in his said petition and final report.

6th. That said account is a just, true, complete and faithful account and record of all the acts and doings of said administrator in said matter and should be settled, allowed, ratified and confirmed by this Court in all things.

7th. That after paying the expenses of said administration there now remains in the hands of the said administrator to be distributed in accordance with the term of the Will of said deceased, the sum of \$51.22.

8th. That all specific legacies provided for in said Will have been fully paid by said Executor.

9th. That the only persons now interested in said estate are the following named legatees, to-wit, Elmer E. Adams, George S. Adams, named in said will respectively as E. E. Adams, and G. S. Adams, Mrs Mary Mansfield, now Mary Carkum, Mrs Alice Hobbs, Mrs Candace Cole, and Mrs. Anna Hankey, and the heirs at law and legatees of Mrs. Cora B. Hunter, deceased, who are sole residuary legatees and as such are intitled to share in the distribution of said personal estate and in the unsold portion of said real estate in the following portions and interest. The said Elmer E. Adams, the one seventh part and interest thereof, the said George S. Adams, Mary Carkum, Alice Hobbs, Candace Cole and Anna Hankey each the one seventh part and interest therein and the estate of Cora B. Hunter, deceased, the one seventh part and interest therein.

10th. That neither said estate of John R. Adams nor any of said legatees is liable in the said matter for the payment of any inheritance tax.

Wherefore it is by the Court considered, ordered and adjudged that each and all of the aforesaid findings, be, and they hereby are, ratified and confirmed. That said administrator pay into this court the said sum of \$51.22 for distribution as aforesaid which is accordingly done. And it is further ordered that said administrator be exonerated and discharged from any and all further duties and liabilities by reason of the said administration.
