Joseph Friend  
Certificate No. 4167.

The United States of America, to all to whom these presents shall come greeting:  
Whereas Joseph Friend of Custer and Buffalo Counties, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Joseph Friend according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of public lands," and the acts supplemental thereto for the East half of the South West quarter of Section thirty-five in township thirteen North, and the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section three in township twelve North, of Range seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty-one acres and fifty-nine hundredths of an acre according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Joseph Friend. Now know ye that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Joseph Friend and to his heirs, the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, thereto belonging, unto the said Joseph Friend, <sup>and his heirs and assigns forever</sup> In testimony whereof, I, Benjamin Harrison, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
