To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Acts of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874 and June 14, 1878, "To encourage the growth of Timber on the Western Prairies," the claim of Joseph Ditzg has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South West quarter of Section fourteen, in Township ten north of range sixteen west of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye, that there is, therefore granted by the United States unto the said Joseph Ditzg the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joseph Ditzg and to his heirs and assigns forever.


