Cardner* has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

South East quarter of Section eighteen, in Township eleven North of range fourteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres.

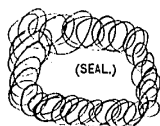
