

The United States of America, To all whom these presents shall come greeting: Certificate No. 1458, Whereas Franklin O Goodwin of Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the general Land Office of the United States a certificate of the register of the land office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Franklin O. Goodwin according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provisions for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the North West quarter of section eight, in township eight North of range thirteen, West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said Tract has been purchased by the said Franklin O. Goodwin.

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Franklin O. Goodwin and to his heirs the said Tract above described; to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging unto the said Franklin O. Goodwin and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington the tenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixth.
