To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting:  
Certificate No. 2222.

Whereas Charles J. Grable of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Charles J. Grable according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April 1820, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the Lot numbered Five of Section Nine in Township Eight North of Range Fifteen West of the Fifth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing Fifty Seven acres and fifty hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of said lands returned to the general Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said Charles J. Grable. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Charles J. Grable and to his heirs the said tract above described. To have and to hold the same together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Charles J. Grable and to his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, has caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the general Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington the twentieth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty five and of the independence of the United States the one hundred and ninth.
