

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John Lugin has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the east half of the south west quarter of Section four in township nine north of range thirteen west in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska containing eighty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:


