Bishop* has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the *North East Quarter of Section Thirty four in Township Eleven North of Range Sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing One thousand and sixty acres* according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
