Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Emily H. Harrison has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the lots numbered one, two, three and four of Section ten, in Township eight North of Range eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty-six acres and eighty hundredths of an acre, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Emily H. Harrison the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Emily H. Harrison and to her heirs and assigns forever.
