Homestead Certificate No. 8352. } Application 12983. }

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Irving Staggard has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North west quarter of section ten in township ten north of range eighteen west of the sixth principal meridian, in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty one acre and five hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Irving Staggard the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Irving Staggard and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1873, March 13, 1874, June 14, 1875 "To Encourage the Growth of Timber on the Western Prairies" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Christian Schilling has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the Lots numbered fifteen, sixteen, twenty five and twenty six of section six in Township ten north of Range eighteen west of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Christian Schilling the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Christian Schilling and to his heirs and assigns forever.
