Whitaker has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North East Quarter of Section Twenty four, in Township eleven, North of Range Fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General :
