To all to whom these Presents shall come, greeting:
 Certificate No. 1212. Whereas Frank Howe of
 Buffalo County Nebraska has deposited in the General
 Land Office of the United States a certificate of the
 Register of the Land office at Grand Island, Nebraska
 whereby it appears that full payment has been made by
 the said Frank Howe according to the provisions of
 the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled
 "An Act making further provision for the sale of the
 Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto, for the
 north half of the north East quarter of Section twenty
 six in Township ten north of range sixteen West
 of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, contain-
 ing eighty acres, according to the Official Plat of
 the Survey of said lands, returned to the General
 Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said
 Tract has been purchased by the said Frank Howe

Now, know ye, That the United States of America,
 in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with
 the several Acts of Congress in such case made and
 provided, have given and granted, and by these presents
 do give and grant, unto the said Frank Howe and to his
 heirs, the said Tract above described, to have and to hold
 to him, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities
 and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto
 belonging, unto the said Frank Howe and to his heirs
 and assigns forever. In testimony whereof, Chester
 A. Arthur, President of the United States of America,
 have caused these letters to be made Patent and the
 Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

 sixth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
 dred and eighty one, and of the Independence of the United
 States the one hundred and sixth.
