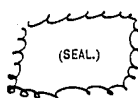

North half of the south west-quarter and the lots numbered nine (9) and ten (10) of section twelve (12) in Township Eight-north of range seventeen west of the sixth principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and twenty seven acres and forty hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Daniel Hostetter the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Daniel Hostetter and to his heirs and assigns forever.

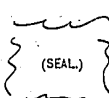
