

Kearny has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

North half of the west west-quarter and the north half of the north east quarter of section ten in Township Eleven north of Range Seventeen west of the sixth Principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John W. Kearny the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John W. Kearny and to his heirs and assigns forever.
