

The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come. Greeting:
Homestead Certificate No. 230.

Application No. 2648. } Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain" and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Joseph Jentes has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law for the North half of the south west quarter and the North half of the south east quarter of section Thirty two in Township Ten North of Range sixteen west, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now know ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said Joseph Jentes the tract of Land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Joseph Jentes and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In witness whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the city of Washington, the Tenth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy four, and of the Independence of the United States the ninety eighth.
