Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska... whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Anna Johnson, Widow of Carl Johnson deceased, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South West quarter of Section Eighteen in Township Ten North of Range Eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres and twenty hundredths of an acre according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
