

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Walter C. Blomsted has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the North West Quarter of Section fourteen, in Township nine North of Range sixteen West in the district of lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
