Russell has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South half of the South West quarter of section thirty in Township eleven North of Range thirteen West of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing seventy seven acres and forty hundredths of an acre

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
