Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Frank Kenney has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the north west-quarter of section thirty four in Township ten north of Range sixteen west of the sixth Principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Fred Bacon has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the north east-quarter of section twelve in Township Eleven north of Range thirteen west of the sixth Principal meridian in Nebraska containing eighty acres according to the official plat of said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said Fred Bacon and is his heirs the said tract - now known as that the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided have given and granted and by these Presents do give and grant unto the said Fred Bacon and to his heirs the said tract - now described to have and to hold the said land together with all the rights and appurtenances thereof unto the said Fred Bacon and to his heirs and assigns forever according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General.
