Meeting: Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that pursuant to the Acts of Congress approved March 3 1872, March 13 1874 and June 14 1875 "to Encourage the growth of Timber on the Western Prairies" the claim of The Heirs of Joshua P King deceased has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the West half of the North East quarter of Section eight in Township nine North of Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing eighty acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the surveyor General.

Now know Ye that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Heirs of Joshua P King deceased the tract of land above described. To have and to hold the said tract of land with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Heirs of Joshua P King deceased and to their heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of the United States of America have cause these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington the fourth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth.
