The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come
speaking: Whereas there has been deposited in the General Land Office a
certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska,
whereby it appears that pursuant to the act of Congress approved 20th
May, 1862. To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain,
and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John W. Lafollett has
been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for
the North half of the North West quarter and the West half of the North
East quarter of Section eighteen, in Township twelve North of Range fifteen
West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one
hundred and fifty three and sixty four hundredths of an acre, ac-
cording to the official plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the
General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye, that there is
therefore granted by the United States unto the said John W. Lafollett the
tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of
land with the appurtenances thereunto the said John W. Lafollett
and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison, President of the United
States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the
seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
Given under my hand at the city of Washington the twenty ninth
day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and ninety and of the Independence of the United States the one
hundred and fifteenth.
