Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Lincoln Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Dolly Phillips has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the South East Quarter of Section Eight in Township eleven North of Range Fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing One hundred and sixty Acres according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:
