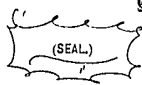

South West quarter of Section two in Township eight north of Range fifteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Simon Landis the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Simon Landis and to his heirs and assigns forever.

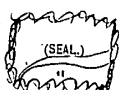
