The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come greeting:

Whereas Sidon Bayton, of Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Sidon Bayton, according to the provisions of the act of Congress, of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled, "An act making further provision for the sale of the public lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for the North East quarter of Section eleven in township twelve North, of Range sixteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Sidon Bayton, Now knowye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Sidon Bayton and to his heirs, the said tract above described, to have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of what ever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Sidon Bayton and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand at the city of Washington, the first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and tenth.
