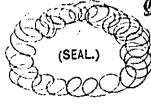

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said *Valentine Ambrose* the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Valentine Ambrose* and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.
