

Whereas, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that, pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To Secure Homesteads to Actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of William Luchs, has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law, for the North half of the North East Quarter and the East half of the North West Quarter of Section eight, in Township eleven, North of Range seventeen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said William Luchs the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William Luchs and to his heirs and assigns forever.


