

The United States of America. To all to whom these Presents shall come greeting: whereas, in pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved July 2, 1867, entitled, "An act donating Public Lands to the several States and Territories which may provide Colleges for the benefit of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts;" there has been deposited in the General Land Office Scrips No 424 for one Quarter Section of Land in favor of the State of Virginia, duly assigned by the proper authority of the said State to Anna O'Neil, widow of John H. O'Neil, deceased, with evidence that the same has been located upon the North East Quarter of Section twenty-eight, in Township nine, North of Range Fifteen West in the District of Lands subject to sale at Grand Island Nebraska, containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General Howard Knudsen, that there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Anna O'Neil, as assignee as aforesaid, and to her heirs, the tract of land above described: To have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereto, unto the said Anna O'Neil as assignee as aforesaid, and to her heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, President of the United States of America, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington the first day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and of the Independence of the United States the thirty-sixth.
