Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of Candis Klatter widow of Charles A Klatter deceased has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the



Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said Candis Klatter the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Candis Klatter and to his heirs and assigns forever.


