To all to whom these presents shall come greeting;
 Certificate No. 2628. — Whereas John W. Ormstead of
 Buffalo County, Nebraska has deposited in the General
 Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of
 the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska whereby it appears
 that full payment has been made by the said John W.
 Ormstead according to the provisions of the Act of Congress
 of the 21st of April 1820 entitled "An Act making further
 provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts
 supplemental thereto for the North East quarter of the
 South East quarter the South East quarter of the North
 East quarter and the West half of the South East quarter
 of Section twelve in Township twelve North of Range
 eighteen West of the Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska
 containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the
 official Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the
 General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been
 purchased by the said John W. Ormstead, Now know ye that the
 United States of America in consideration of the premises and
 in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case
 made and provided have given and granted and by these
 presents do give and grant unto the said John W. Ormstead ^{and}
 to his heirs the said tract above described. To have and to
 hold the same to gether with all the rights privileges
 immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature
 thereunto belonging unto the said John W. Ormstead and to
 his heirs Assigns forever In testimony whereof I Benjamin
 Harrison President of the United States of America have caused
 these letters to be made Patent and the seal of the General
 Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at
 the City of Washington the twenty third day of December in
 the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty
 nine and of the Independence of the United State the one
 hundred and fourteenth.
