

The United States of America, To all to whom
these presents shall come greeting:

Whereas Thomas J. Peck of Buffalo
County Nebraska has deposited in the General
Land Office of the United States a certificate of the
Register of the Land Office at Grand Island
Nebraska, whereby it appears that full payment
has been made by the said Thomas J. Peck according
to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of
April 1820 entitled, "An act making further provision
for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental
thereto for the South East quarter of Section Thirty six
Township Nine North of Range Thirteen West of the
Sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one
hundred and sixty acres, according to the Official
Plat of the survey of the said lands, returned to the General
Land Office by the Surveyor General which said
tract has been purchased by the said Thomas J. Peck.

Now know ye, that the United States of America, in
consideration of the premises, and in conformity with
the several Acts of Congress in such case made and
provided, have given and granted, and by these presents
do give and grant, unto the said Thomas J. Peck and
to his heirs, the said Tract above described; To have
and to hold the same, together with all the rights
privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of what-
soever nature thereunto belonging unto the said
Thomas J. Peck and to his heirs and assigns
forever.
