To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:  
Whereas, by virtue of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Section of the Act of Congress approved January 28<sup>th</sup> 1879, supplemental to the Acts approved June 22<sup>d</sup> 1860, March 2<sup>d</sup> 1867, and June 10<sup>th</sup> 1872, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island, Nebraska, whereby it appears that Supreme Court Scrip No. R. 223 - Subdivision No. - for 160 acres, has been located by William W. Pool and his claim thereby established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the east half of the north east quarter and the east half of the south east quarter of section twelve in township eleven north, of range fifteen west of the sixth principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres according to the official plat of the Survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General. Now know ye that there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said William W. Pool, the tract of land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William W. Pool and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Chester A. Arthur, President of the United States of America have caused Certificates to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, at the City of Washington, the first day of June, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and eighty two, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and sixth.
