Certificate No. 3832.

Whereas James W. Ough of Buffalo County
Nebraska has deposited in the General Land
Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land
Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that full
payment has been made by the said James W. Ough according
to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April
1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale
of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the
North half of the ~~South~~ West quarter of Section Eighteen in Township
Twelve North of Range Fourteen West of the Sixth Principal
Meridian in Nebraska containing seventy eight acres and
seventy eight hundredths of an acre according to the Official
Plat of the Survey of the said lands returned to the General
Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has
been purchased by the said James W. Ough. Now know Ye
that the United States of America in consideration of the
promises and in conformity with the Survey Acts of Congress in
such case made and provided have given and granted and by these
presents do give and grant unto the said James W. Ough
and to his heirs the said tract above described to have and to hold
the same together with all the rights privileges immunities
and appurtenances of whatever nature thereto belonging
unto the said James W. Ough and to his heirs and assigns
forever In testimony whereof I Benjamin Harrison President of
the United States of America have caused these letters to be made
Patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed
Given under my hand at the City of Washington the
twenty ninth day of October in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and eighty nine and of the Independence
of the United States the one hundred and fourteenth
