Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved, 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John W. Shahan has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the

lots numbered three and four of section four and the lot numbered six of section five in Township Eight north of Range thirteen west of the sixth principal meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and forty four acres and forty hundredths of an acre
