Spooner according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 21st of April 1820 entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands" and the acts supplemental thereto for the North West quarter of Section 36 in Township 22nd North of range 10th West of the sixth Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing one hundred and sixty acres, according to the Official plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General which said tract has been purchased by the said William S. Spooner. Now know ye that the United States of America in consideration of the promises and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said William S.
