
Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Grand Island Nebraska whereby it appears that, pursuant to the act of Congress, approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of John Pearson has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the South half of the South East quarter of Section seven and the North half of the North East quarter of Section eighteen in Township twelve North of Range sixteen West of the Principal Meridian in Nebraska containing One hundred and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the United States unto the said John Pearson the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said John Pearson and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I Grover Cleveland President of the United States of America have caused these letters to be made patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
